Scholarship Program Instructions & Application Forms

Award Categories

College/University Study

Scholarships will be considered for vo-tech, community college, and university courses of study to MNLA members and their families and employees.

Short Course Study

Scholarships will be considered for short courses offered to those in the horticultural industry. Short courses may include, but are not limited to, the following: industry conferences and conventions, certification preparation courses, master gardener programs, and other relevant classes or programs offered by federal, state, or local government agencies. Funds in this award category may be requested for registration fees/tuition, books and/or required materials, and related travel expenses. Application must be made before course work begins or before course work is completed. Applications for courses already completed will not be considered. Application forms for short course study can be found on our website, www.plantingmontana.com, or requested by contacting the MNLA office.



General Scholarship Application Instructions

The Montana Nursery & Landscape Association (MNLA) offers oneyear education scholarships to students each year. The typical application period is once-a-year in the Fall, but an additional Spring application period may be offered if scholarship funds are available. The amount of the award is based upon the applicant's need, the extent to which the field of study corresponds to the Association's focus and interest, and the availability of Association scholarship funds.

Purpose

It is MNLA's intention to strengthen the Montana nursery and landscape industry by supporting the education of its members and their families and employees.

Eligibility

Applicants must be either an active member of the Montana Nursery and Landscape Association (Montana residents only) or an immediate family member or employee of an active member company. The education program may be in a horticulture-related field or other degree program.

Applications in the College/University Study award category must be high school Seniors or students currently enrolled in a higher education program for the award semester. This includes vocational, trade school, 4-year bachelor's program, masters, or PhD program.

Notification

All applications will be reviewed by the MNLA Board of Directors. All applicants will be notified of the Board's scholarship decisions following the application period. Applicants who apply during the Spring application period will be notified in June, with award checks issued prior to the start of their Fall semester. Applications received during the Fall application period will be notified in December, with the award issued the following January. Scholarship recipients are invited to attend the MT Green Expo in January to receive recognition for their award.

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□ 1.	Letter of application – Must be type written (3 pages maximum) and include the following:
	 a. Course information - a summary of the course the applicant wishes to attend, dates and location of course, and potential benefit of course;
	 Applicant's current work/study in horticulture – a summary of your current job or course of study in the horticultural field, and any specialty horticulture interests;
	 MNLA involvement – brief summary or involvement with the Association or past participation in MNLA events;
	 Identification of MNLA member sponsor – statement regard-ing relationship to an MNLA member firm, such as "daughter of owner of member nursery, XYZ Nursery & Landscaping" or "employee of member nursery, XYZ Nursery".
	e. Course budget – brief itemization of amount and purpose of scholarship funds being requested. You may request whole or partial funding.

2. Letter of support from MNLA member sponsor. This letter can be from the owner, manager, or other managing personnel employed by a member firm.

3. Copy of course promotional materials – this may include the conference brochure, flyer, or other promotional material that completely describes the course content, identifies speakers, course sponsor, and cost.

4. Confirmation of registration - if you have already registered for the course, please provide a copy of your confirmation. If you have not yet registered, your scholarship award is contingent upon proof of registration and funds may not actually be issued until registration can be confirmed.

General Scholarship Application Instructions

Scholarship Frequently Asked Questions

Q: I am currently a high school Senior, about to enter a vocational, trade school, or other 2-year program in the Fall. Can I apply for the College/University Scholarship?

A: Yes

Q: I already have a bachelor's degree and am starting graduate school. Can I apply for the College/University Scholarship? A: Yes

Q: I am not an MNLA Member, but I am currently employed at an MNLA company. Can I apply for a Short Course Study or College/University scholarship?

A: Yes, you can apply for whichever scholarship is suitable for your situation.

Q: I'm currently employed at an MNLA company, though I do not have a personal membership. Can my child apply for a scholar-ship even though they are not choosing a horticulture related field?

A: Yes. MNLA views this as part of providing a benefit to its members and their employees.

Q: I have already received a scholarship from the MNLA. Can I apply again?

A: Yes, previously receiving the scholarship does not automatically disqualify you, though preference may be given to students who have not previously received a scholarship.

Q: I am not an MNLA member, though I am currently studying in a horticulture related field. Can I apply for this scholarship?

A: Consider getting a student membership! The student rate is far lower than the standard membership and includes many benefits such as: discounted rates to MNLA events, receiving the Leaflet Newsletter and other MNLA publications, free access to an electronic version of the Certified Plant Professional Manual, as well as the financial benefit of being able to apply for the scholarship.

Q: What is the purpose of the Short Course Study Scholarship?

A: MNLA's intent is to support continuing education for those in the industry. A class on retaining wall construction or plant pest identification/control could greatly benefit a member and improve their industry knowledge. MNLA views this as providing a benefit to its members.

Q: I am an MNLA member. Can I apply for the Short Course Study to help educate my employees?

A: Yes, if you are sending an employee to a workshop related to the horticulture business, you may apply for the Short Course Study. There may be limits to how many employees will receive the funds, and there may be a cap for each company. Therefore, we highly recommend reaching out to the MNLA prior to the workshop so you know how much funding may be available to you.
